## **Full Festival Program Revealed**

### ***Food, Murder, Imagination and Escape***

**Lunenburg, Nova Scotia** – The full program of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Lunenburg Doc Fest is now available. Nine feature films and an assortment of short programs will be screened at the Lunenburg Opera House over four days, from September 22 to 25<sup>th</sup>.

The main feature program includes the following full length documentaries:

This year we will explore the control of our food supply (Seed, Bluefin). We will see two different approaches to using the power of imagination to invent and change worlds (Harold and Lilian, Maya Angelou). The universal desire to escape oppression is explored in a domestic and international context (The Pass System, The Crossing). History is linked to the present using words and wood (Obit, Bluenose). Music and murder combine in a story of passion played out in the world of jazz (I Called Him Morgan).

Juried awards will be presented for best Feature Documentary, Atlantic Filmmaker, and Short Film. A new LDF Audience Award will also be presented.

Attendees will hear behind the camera stories over cocktails or in Question and Answer sessions. It is a rare chance to see these films on a big screen, in the presence of an appreciative audience.
