The fourth Lunenburg Doc Fest will kick off with the first Nova Scotia showing of the acclaimed music documentary Rumble: The Indians Who Rocked the World.

Rumble demonstrates the depth of influence that Indigenous North Americans have had on the ongoing evolution of rock and roll, according to a news release. The documentary is a hit on the film festival circuit, garnering rave reviews along the way. It was also the winner of the \$50,000 Rogers Audience Award at the Hot Docs festival in Toronto.

Rumble will have a single showing Sept. 21 at 7 p.m. A post-film party will give audience members and filmmakers a chance to mingle.

The festival will be held in the refurbished Lunenburg Opera House Sept. 21-24. Films from the Atlantic region and around the world will be screened, and there will be sessions for filmmakers and industry partners.

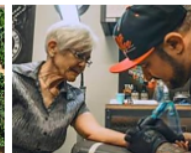
